PURPOSE OF WOODLORE CAMPING SCHOOL

Woodlore emphasizes the Patrol Method, Leadership Skills, and the practical application of Pioneering style camping.

Scouts build their own campsite, spend a day as leader of their patrol, and earn the Pioneering Merit Badge.

Woodlore graduates gain confidence in their personal outdoor ability while learning to function as part of a group.

HISTORY OF THE WOODLORE CAMPING SCHOOL

In early 1970, scout leaders Reynolds Wallace Jr., Leckie Mattox, and Jess Walker from the Choctaw District, Alabama-Florida Council, met with District Executive John Bane to discuss training for boy leaders. The guide for their discussion was an old Wood Badge syllabus, from which they devised a camping skills and junior leader training course.

The first Camping and Woodlore School was held for the Choctaw District March 11, 1970 at Cahaba Wildlife Management Area, Centreville, Alabama. The school was an outstanding success.

Following the conclusion of the second school, numerous requests were received from other districts to allow their Scouts to

attend this popular program. Responding to these requests, the Executive Board of the Alabama-Florida Council adopted the Woodlore Camping School as a Council program with the stated purpose of teaching Scoutcraft, Pioneering and the Patrol Method.

Through the efforts of those early leaders, along with the many Scouts and Scouters who have followed, Woodlore has provided leadership training and camping skills to Scouts for 36 years. It is a program like no other, and unique to the Alabama-Florida Council.
